

Community Partner Report – Sedgefield Middle School

Jenny and I participated in our last Community Partner meeting with Sedgefield for the year and wanted to share some of the highlights:

- ⇒ Principal Miracle shared that in spite of a challenging year brought on by the pandemic and issues never before confronted by students or staff, Sedgefield had an exceptional year.
- ⇒ The school year began with 535 students and ended with 520, an outstanding number meaning that only a few were "lost" during the year.
- ⇒ Several students were "located" during the year including one who had missed over 100 days. She was brought back in and managed to pass her end-of-grade testing due to intense work from staff.
- ⇒ Attendance averaged about 87% for the year compared to about 92% the previous year. Given the circumstances, Principal Miracle characterized this as remarkable.
- ⇒ Attendance during end-of-grade testing actually increased to about 90%, again, an impressive number.
- ⇒ A special acknowledgment was given to those groups which provided "attendance incentive" prizes for students. (This includes the Dilworth Rotary Club.)
- ⇒ Math 1 students did remarkably well in testing with 7th graders testing out at 100% and 8th graders at 89-90%. These honors courses will ensure students receive high school credits.
- ⇒ Band teacher Demeka Kimpson of Sedgefield was selected as the overall teacher of the year for the CMS School District. CMS names 2021 teacher, teacher assistant of the year
- ⇒ Finally, we saw pictures of the garden constructed at Sedgefield by community partners.

As a Club, we can take a great deal of pride in knowing that we helped Sedgefield achieve some of these impressive outcomes.






