# **MAJORS TODD & WILMA MASON**



Majors Mason have been appointed as the Area Commanders for The Salvation Army of Greater Charlotte, effective June 22, 2020. The role includes overseeing all programs, services and operations for the organization: Center of Hope shelter and housing programs; Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Charlotte; Christmas assistance; emergency disaster response; and more.

Major Todd Mason was born and raised in Louisville, Ky., and has a degree in Business Administration. He is a graduate of Evangeline Booth College in Atlanta, Ga., and has done additional studies at Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary in Charlotte. Major Wilma Mason is a native of Ft. Myers, Fla., and has a degree in Christian

Teaching. She is a graduate of Evangeline Booth College. Both Majors are also graduates of The Salvation Army's International College for Officers in London.

Their ministry and leadership together began as Corps Officers/Pastors at Corps Community Centers in Morehead City, N.C.; Rocky Mount, N.C..; Louisville South, Ky., (which includes a Boys & Girls Club); and in Johnson City, Tenn. These locations included homeless shelters, social service programs, Family Stores, Corps programming and feeding kitchens.

In 2008, the Masons were appointed to Augusta, Ga., Command to oversee operations, along with the fundraising, construction and opening of the Ray & Joan Kroc Corps Community Center (Kroc Center). Following Augusta, they were appointed to Evangeline Booth College and served as part of the faculty. Their most recent appointments were at Southern Territorial Headquarters in Atlanta, where Major Todd Mason served as the Director of Grants and Contracts and Major Wilma Mason supported the Secretary for Personnel.



# NC MedAssist May 12, 2021







In 2014, the NewGen Peacebuilders program launched in Charlotte, NC, with 18 students from three high schools. Rotary District 7680 and local Rotary clubs have provided financial and volunteer support in the first year and each year since.

Alumni have been recognized with awards and scholarships from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, UNC-Charlotte, NC State University, Warren Wilson College, and Stanford. The video case study of the peace project co-led by Sara Holley has inspired young peacebuilders in multiple states and countries.

On May 15, high school students in Mecklenburg, Gaston, Union and Cabarrus counties will complete their NewGen Peacebuilders experience and present peace project results to family, friends, and the public. The number of certified NewGen Peacebuilders from Metro Charlotte will surpass 500 young people.
